#### CBCS – Honours

##### ***CC-1: History of India from the earliest times to c 300 BCE***

###### Course Objective -

The course intends to provide an extensive and deeper understanding of early Indian history to the students.

##### ***CC- 2: Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of the ancient world other than India***

###### Course Objective -

This course aims to introduce the students to the significant developments in world history that shaped the complexity of human existence .

##### ***CC- 3: History of India C 300 BCE to C 750 CE***

###### Course Objective -

This course intends to provide information of changing socio- cultural and economic scenario manifested in changing dynastic pattern in India from early historic to early medieval phase.

##### ***CC- 4: Social Formation and Cultural patterns of the Medieval World other than India***

###### Course Objective –

The course seeks to understand the transition of Ancient Europe in to the medieval world.

##### ***CC-5: History of India (CE 750-1206)***

###### Course Objective -

The course seeks to provide an understanding of early medieval India to the Sultanate time.

##### ***CC – 6: Rise of the Modern West – I***

###### Course objective-

This course aims to explain the transition of Europe from feudalism to capitalism.

##### ***CC-7: History of India (C 1206 – 1526)***

###### Course Objective -

This paper focuses on the polity, society and economy, culture and religion of the Delhi Sultanate.

***CC-8: Rise of the Modern West – II***

Course Objective –

The course seeks to provide an understanding of the major path breaking changes that took place around the mid 17<sup>th</sup> and late 18<sup>th</sup> century Europe.

***CC- 9: History of India ( C 1526 – 1605 )***

Course Objective -

The course aims to introduce the students to the major political developments in the history of India during the sixteenth and early seventeenth century.

***CC -10: History of India (C 1605 -1750s)***

Course Objective –

The course objective is to make the students understand the major political developments in the history of India during the period between the seventeenth and mid-eighteenth century.

***CC-11: History of Modern Europe (C 1789 – 1939)***

Course Objective –

The course seeks to explain the major watersheds in European history beginning with the 1780s to the beginning of the Second World War.

***CC-12: History of India (c. 1750s -1857)***

Course Objective –

The course seeks to provide a deeper understanding of the process of transformation of India during the eighteenth century into the colonial power.

***CC-13: History of India (c.1857 -1964 )***

Course Objective -

The course introduces the students to India's freedom struggle followed by India's independence and finally to the Nehru era.

***CC-14: History of World Politic: 1945 – 1994***

Course objective-

The course seeks to delineate some important aspects of the twentieth century World.

The course aims to introduce the students to Museums and archives as the most important repositories of visual and material remains of the past.
